Competition between refugees and host communities for farmland, access to water, health and education services, and firewood.



Humanitarian Needs

All arriving refugees need access to asylum, including respective procedures

Basic services are needed, especially for refugees with special needs

Protect the children; 50% are under 18 years old, are separated from families, are placed into forced labor become child soldiers

Living conditions in refugee camps and host communities must be improved

Access to water, sanitation, education and health services

sanitation facilities in camps and host communities are poor

Support for UNHCR's durable solutions, especially repatriation and local integration

Resettlement is required for refugees with special needs

The Central African Republic (CAR) is one of the poorest countries in the world.

For too many years, CAR has had trouble and unrest.

In March 2013, rebels forced CAR's president out of office.

After that, constant conflicts between military groups have forced almost 25% of CAR's population from their homes.

Most of them fled to neighboring countries to seek asylum.

However, these neighboring countries are also poor, and have few resources for the CAR refugees.
